She will also present her NASA internship research which focused on understanding the geochemical conditions on the surface of Venus during the possible transition between past habitable conditions and the present-day hot and dry environment.



Biography: Haskelle Trigue White is a senior geoscience major at OSU. Although her first year was online, she quickly became involved in research and is now a geochemist technician for a hydrogeology lab. Comfortable and skilled in the laboratory environment, she's done research into how land topography influences terrestrial water processes and soil properties. The Tanaka Scholarship helped Haskelle apply for and complete a NASA internship working under a planetary geochemist at the University of Arkansas.
